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

# Background

- Hepatitis A is a contagious liver infection spread through infected stool
- Low vaccination rates in adults and poor access to hygiene opportunities have led to an increase in cases
- Statewide increase since April 2019
- Statewide hepatitis A outbreak declared in July 2019


## Background



#### Since April 2019:

- 17 counties impacted
- 370 cases
- 214 hospitalizations
- 6 deaths

#### Nationwide outbreaks




## Hepatitis A Vaccine

- Vaccination is the best way to prevent hepatitis A
- Quick action by public health has helped to control the outbreak. As of January 2020:
  - ◆ 10,440 vaccine doses ordered by local health jurisdictions
  - 8,000 doses administered
  - ◆ 500 vaccination events held statewide
- 2020 orders:
  - **♦3,130** vaccine doses



# Case Reporting during COVID-19

- Case reporting times may be longer than usual
- Reduction in cases since February 2020 may be due to fewer people seeking testing/treatment for hepatitis A



# Hepatitis A in Correctional Settings

- Cases identified in correctional facilities in Washington state
- Hepatitis A infection can be serious, particularly in patients with underlying health conditions, and/or:
  - Drug use (injection or non-injection)
  - Liver disease (hepatitis B, hepatitis C, etc.)
  - Homelessness or unstable housing
  - Any of the above and have HIV infection

#### Vaccination Outreach Models

#### **Spokane Regional Health District**

- Conducts weekly outreach and hepatitis A vaccinations
  - Strong partnership with county jail and designated corrections officer
  - Public health nurse and immunizations program coordinator
  - Cell-to-cell outreach & vaccination (with consent)
  - Vaccination of food service workers

#### Yakima Health District

Prioritizes vaccination for inmates who report homelessness/unstable housing at intake
