

What is Community Engagement &



• Trust: building relationships with people who are suspicious of mainstream institutions.

- CHWs:
 - Live in and share culture, language, and life experiences with the members of the communities they serve
 - Have earned and enjoy a deep level of trust with peers and neighbors
 - Demonstrate strong relational expertise and interpersonal communication skills
 - Have deep relationships and knowledge of local communitybased resources



Be present

Calm, address basic needs (cookies), touch.



Listen

- Everyone around me is dying
- Are you sure I am I going to die if I get the vaccine?
- Heroin Addict worried the vaccine will interfere
- Poor relationship with mother



Southwest Washington Equity Coalition Transparency

I'll do it with you

- Talk to the pharmacist
- Fill out the form together
- Go with him to the pharmacist. Which arm?







Southwest Washington Equity Coalition Take Time

15-minute wait

- Stay with him. Knees, bows, thank you, thank you. Bows back.....
- Give him food and masks
- Put vaccine card in his passport, inside his jacket.
- He doesn't know where he is going to sleep.
- Wants to bring mom to get her vaccine.
