






HPV Doses Administered 9-10 Year Olds





Summary

The data show our work is having an effect! But more work remains.

- Age 9-10 administrations and percentage of the age group vaccinated continue to rise but still have a ways to go.
- Percent of 11–12-year-olds with at least one dose of HPV remain lower than those with at least one dose of Tdap and meningococcal. Efforts still need to be made to close that gap.
- You can help prevent certain cancers! Keep promoting and offering HPV vaccine to everyone age 9 to 26 who isn't up to date. Providers can have a discussion with and may vaccinate patients up to age 45.

Getting Your Annual Flu Vaccine

Annual flu vaccines are safe and recommended to everyone 6 months and older

- Most people just need one annual flu vaccine to protect themselves against severe illness from the flu.
- Children 6 months through 8 years getting a flu vaccine for the first time, or who have only previously gotten one dose of flu vaccine, should get two doses of vaccine. If your child needs two doses, work with your provider to get the first dose before the fall season. That way you will have time to get your child fully vaccinated before flu activity increases in the fall.
- Some people are at higher risk of severe illness from the flu. This includes: adults age 65 and older, children under 5 years old, pregnant people and people with underlying medical conditions (like lung disease, heart disease, or a weakened immune system).

What types of flu vaccines are available?

Injectable

For people 6 months to 64 years old, there are no recommendations for one brand of flu vaccine over another. All flu vaccines for 2023-24 protect against four strains of the influenza virus. The vaccine composition is updated every year to match the most current circulating strains.

Nasal spray

This is a live attenuated vaccine (LAIV), approved for people age 2 years to 49 years. This vaccine type is not recommended for pregnant people, immunocompromised people, older adults and people with certain medical injuries.

High dose and adjuvanted These vaccines create a stronger immune response. This vaccine type is recommended for adults age 65 and older.

WA DOH Goes to Poland for a UN Visit!

Vadim Kogan, Ekaterina Teterina and Olga Okhapkina from DOH went to Poland with the United Nations' International Organization for Migration to talk about our work to increase vaccine confidence in Ukrainain- and Russian-speaking communities in Washington for the past 5 years.

Went to advise these groups on how to build vaccine confidence in refugees from Ukraine.



WA DOH Goes to Poland for a UN Visit!

- We presented our work to a UN delegation including UNICEF; WHO; CDC's international arm; and the governments of Moldova, Poland, and Belarus.
- The trip highlighted how Washington is a leader in this work on an international scale!
- The 3 countries didn't have translated materials or ad campaigns, and only 1 provided trainings.
- Vadim also did some brainstorming and advising for these international partners on how to improve their work.

Roses are red, violets are blue, measles is preventable and so is the flu.


- Virtual Meetings: 3rd Tuesdays of the month for 1 hour, monthly during respiratory illness season (November – March), bimonthly April – October.
- Membership: Ajia McAferty (chair), Drashti Patel (staff support), and 19 immunization stakeholders
- Purpose: To identify and reduce barriers to vaccines which prevent respiratory illness (RSV, COVID-19, and influenza) among residents of Washington State through healthcare provider education and community engagement.
- **Structure:** resource sharing, data review, and planning what we want to accomplish as a subcommittee together through March 2025

Theory of Change: COM-B Model Behavior

 The COM-B Model states capability, motivation, and opportunity must be present for behavior change. We propose the subcommittee utilize the COM-B model as an evidence-based theory of change to inform and guide the activities of the workgroup. In this subcommittee there are two behaviors (1) healthcare providers offering the immunizations and (2) Washington residents getting vaccinated.

Goal:

- Broad statement that describe the expected outcomes of the subcommittee.
- Increase number of Washington residents in who are vaccinated against COVID-19, influenza, and RSV.

Objectives:

- Precise statements of intended outcomes.
- Increase physical opportunities for WA residents to be vaccinated by the 2024-2025 season.
- Disseminate and compile multilingual vaccine coverage resources and information to IACW network by the 2024-2025 season.
- Increase vaccine confidence in respiratory illness vaccines by 2024-2025 season.
- Increase provider and parent RSV immunizations knowledge, increasing the number of newborns protected by end of 2023-2024 season

- The actions the subcommittee will take collectively and/or individually to accomplish expected and intended outcomes.
